**Parte A. Simple Sentence Structure**

What is a subject?

Person/thing doing the action

What is a verb?

action/word conjugated

What is a direct object? (WRITE DOWN BOTH BOXES)

① person/thing directly affected by the action No!

② look @ verb-ask yourself "who?" or "what?" ¡Sí!

What is an indirect object? (WRITE DOWN BOTH BOXES)

① person/thing indirectly affected by the action No!

② to/for whom an action is done ¡Sí!

**Parte B. Label the parts of the sentence. Just write the letter underneath the part of speech. Follow the example. Some sentences do not have all parts.**

**Subject (S) Indirect Object (IO) Direct Object (DO) Verb (V) Indirect Object Pronoun (IOP)**

EX: Ms. D'Andrea gives us homework.

S V IO DO

Andrea talked to her mother and father.

S V IO

Andrea talked to them.

S V IOP

I have to buy tickets for my friends.

S V V DO IO

I have to buy tickets for them.

S V V DO IOP

I have to buy them tickets.

S V V IOP DO

### Parte C. What are the Indirect Object Pronouns (IOPs)?

English Meaning

Spanish Meaning

to/for me	me
to/for you	te
to/for him <del>me</del> her you (formal)	le
to/for us	nos
to/for you all (Spain)	os
to/for them y'all <del>me</del>	les

### Parte D. What are the "words of emphasis" in Spanish? WE WILL REFER TO THESE AS INDIRECT OBJECTS. THEY ARE IMPORTANT AND REQUIRED EVERY SINGLE TIME!

a mí	a nosotros/a nombre y amí
a ti	a vosotros
a él/a ella/a ud./a nombre	a ellos/a ellas/a uds./a nombre y a nombre

**Parte E. When have you used IOs & IOPs before? (Kind of in the video & kind of in your brain)**

Verbs like gustar

What is ALWAYS your sentence structure with this grammar concept? Use S, V, IO, & IOP

IO IOP V S

^^^This is always the sentence structure because this grammar concept is IRREGULAR!!  
HOWEVER

We are now talking about REGULAR VERBS! How do we use IOs & IOPs with regular verbs?

**Parte F. Placement of IOPs.**

Ms. D'Andrea gives us homework.

**#1- The IOP goes before the conjugated verb if there's one verb.**

Ex: Srta. D'Andrea nos<sup>IOP</sup> da tarea a nosotros. <sup>IO</sup>  
Are YOU allowed to get rid of the a nosotros? Sí o no

In a DVP, the IOP can go before the conjugated verb, but there is also a second option.

**#2- The IOP can also go after the infinitive in a double verb phrase (DVP).**

Ex: El auxiliar de vuelo les<sup>IOP</sup> tiene que dar refrescos. a los pasajeros.<sup>IO</sup>  
OR  
El auxiliar del vuelo tiene que dar les<sup>IOP</sup> refrescos. a los pasajeros.<sup>IO</sup>

If the IOP is attached to the infinitive, the IOP and infinitive are ONE WORD!

^^^This is going to be the way you are REQUIRED to write IOPs with DVPs!
